Project # 2 - A Tribute to Fan Ho (12 Photos) By: Marco Nardozi

INTRODUCTION

For this project, you are required to submit 12 high quality, bring-a-tear-to your-photography-teacher's-eye images.

Your aim is to further expand your understanding of your chosen elements (3 to be exact in the Part 1 portion of this project). Replace the black boxes with your own processed .jpgs (please note, the images doesn't have to be rectangular or landscape mode only. Portrait mode is acceptable too).

If you're an online student and have only access to your phone, you may still shoot your images as a .jpg OR Raw (if your phone allows it). Upload your shot to Drive and then from Drive, open and edit your images in Photopea. Steps in processing can be found in the Part 2 post on our class site.

In-class students must shoot their images using a DSLR, in full manual and Raw format only. You are all to use this same template to organize and submit your work. Please don't change the typeface (ie fonts) as you will lose marks on formatting!

Title: Overflow

I captured perspective and depth in this image by focusing on the the subject in the foreground, the Crush can, and having Talia visibly blurred in the background. She adds depth to the image as the viewer instantly interprets her to be farther away from the lens. The perspective comes from the subject which shows the comparable size of the two entities. The Crush is the same size as Talia, indicating the range of distance from the camera is closer to the can than it is to her.



Title: Beyond Two Worlds

The reflection of the glass from where I was standing clearly showed the students in line. I thought this was very interesting as it shows the infinite depth of reflection and the perspective of seeing two different realities from one viewpoint.



Title: Keys

Visual perspective shows the range of distance between subjects hands. Its an artistic way of creating depth using the piano keys showing how they start large and become smaller through visual perspective.



Title: Composition Chemistry

This picture captures perspective and depth with the two subjects present. I am visibly farther away from Audric, and we are captured in motion making music together. I really like this picture because it captures the chemistry and bond between me and one of my best friends.



Title: Sacred

The cross is the one subject that stands out the most in this image. It is the centre point that grabs the most attention and looks down on all of the students that sit in the cafeteria. There is extreme focus on the cross in this picture. It glows on the wall and emphasizes the loneliness and divinity of its presence.



Title: Ethan

Here we have Ethan standing interesently on a table by himself in the middle of a lone parking lot. I captured this shot from a higher plain to make sure I was the same height as the subject.
